Dear Parents,

With Prep interviews for 2022 having recently commenced, it is timely for you as parents to consider the reasons why you chose to send your child to Emmanuel. choosing a school, parents are signing up to the beliefs and expectations that the school will 'make good' on what they say they will do! This is a big step towards a successful education for your child, but it is not the only step.

There are going to be fundamental values that are at the heart of the school and its philosophy and therefore why it goes about things in the way it does. You, not just your child, is 'signing up' for these values when you join the school community. Honesty, Respect, Dignity, Love, Justice and Faith are values fundamental to our school.

Emmanuel is a Catholic School. Despite what some people may think, we are not a private school! We will always embrace the marginalised and the disadvantaged and welcome all who seek the kind of education that our school offers. We will still keep striving to set high expectations for all, whilst acknowledging that not all begin on the same starting line when they arrive.

I honestly believe if we simply demand of ourselves what we demand of others, focus on being part of solutions rather than just highlighting problems, treat all with respect and dignity, we would not need policies, protocols, rules and regulations. There is no one who can profess to be perfect in all of these pursuits, but if we are not interested in trying to live these values and beliefs out more consistently, even if only in the very least, as models for our children, then I am not sure that Emmanuel is going to meet your needs. This is part of the conversations that take place with new enrolments and, in particular, Prep enrolments. It should also be part of our shared ongoing conversation with each other as existing members of Emmanuel Catholic Primary School.

PATRONESS OF AUSTRALIA

The Feast day of Mary Help of Christians is celebrated on 24 May each year. Here are some quick facts about Australia's special relationship with Mary.

- It is recorded that when there were no priests in colonial Australia, Catholics prayed to Mary to nurture their faith.
- One of the first priests, Father Therry, dedicated the Australian Church to Mary under the title "Help of Christians".
- Australia was the first nation to have Mary, Help of Christians as its patroness and to observe the feast on a national scale.
- In 1815, the feast (24 May) and special title (Our Lady Help of Christians) were introduced by Pope Pius VII in thanksgiving for being liberated from prison. It is also a special day of significance in Australia, because in 1844 the bishops nominated Mary as a special patron of our country under this title.

All NAPLAN tests have now been completed and catch-up tests will be finalised tomorrow for any students who were absent over the testing days.




